As detailed in article 97 of the Japanese constitution, 'fundamental human rights are the fruit of years of effort by mankind for freedom'. Likewise, this support system has been made possible due to the efforts of our predecessors.

Those interested in receiving support should first consult with their guardians and teachers and then make full use of the system in order to open up your future and create a society in which mutual human rights are respected.
